Leavers

The weeks before Christmas were very hectic with lots of fun stuff happening at school. As part of our RE curriculum, we focused on Christmas customs and traditions, finding out about Christmas trees and other traditions around the world. We also had lots of visits and events. The new term means back to work, so this term we have many students preparing for their mock interviews. Everyone completes an application form with their personal information and qualifications, then three staff from local companies will visit school, and talk to the students about themselves and their plans for the future.

Autistic Department

Last term, we had a very busy time. The Primary Autistic dept. took part in the Christmas concert where we marched like soldiers and flew like birds. Quite a few of our pupils had solo parts this year and we are very proud of them. The Senior Autistic dept. took part in the Christingle in St Mary's Church. Our topic last term was stories and rhymes, our favourite story was "The Three Little Pigs". We were able to dress up as the characters and re-enact the story. It is now a Heronsbridge tradition to watch a pantomime at the end of the term and the whole school attended Bridgend College to watch Jack and the Beanstalk. Several of the pupils from the department ran stalls in the Christmas fete where they used their entrepreneurial skills to sell the toys and games.

Primary

It was the Primary department time to be in the big Christmas show. We all worked really hard and everyone told us they enjoyed. We also all enjoyed festive treats such as trips to McArthur Glen, the cinema and St Fagan's. We all saw Father Christmas and enjoyed our Christmas dinner with our friends as well as going to see a pantomime in Bridgend College. We raised £3000 with the help of Bryntirion Comp and Trelales Primary schools to set up an IT room in Tanzania .
