Health Award

A very special guest brightened up the usual Monday morning assembly in February. Porthcawl actress Ruth Jones joined staff and pupils to present us with the Welsh Network of Healthy Schools Scheme National Quality Award. We have been developing awareness of many aspects of healthy living in school for 15 years and are really pleased all our hard work has been recognised. This term we have continued to maintain our links with Brynteg School as four pupils attend weekly Motor Programme sessions. We have extended our healthy activities by participating in sporting activities outside school, taking two teams of six pupils to the table top cricket Welsh finals in the SWALEC Stadium. We were particularly proud of the team of 34 pupils who represented the school in the Rotary Gymnastics and the 22 who have qualified for the Welsh finals.

Centre for Autism

We have been looking at a variety of different animals this half term through lots of different medias. We are lucky to have an IT enthusiast who has created a QR trail around the school. Pupils can access this via iPads and learn more about the animals from the book Dear Zoo. This week we went to Bridgend college to watch Bridgend students perform a variety of songs and tributes. There was lots of dancing and singing by pupils and staff. The DIR/Floortime approach continues to develop within the school and several parents have received hands on training with a specialist DIR provider.
