Leavers

Work experiences are well underway. With the support

of Elite, the supported employment agency, five students have taken part in a 'Preparation for Work' course, and six are now involved in weekly work placements, supported by Elite staff. The staff from Elite work closely with the Leavers' Department to identify strengths and interests of individual students so they can best match students to a placement they will enjoy. This year's choices include working with animals, working in a large plant and garden supplier and working for a local retailer.

<u>Autistic Department</u>

All classes have been working hard looking at all different modes of transport and producing some fantastic artwork. A1, A2 and A3 have been celebrating the creation story where they have explored and experienced the story of our creation.
